



Travel and Visitation

Note: Transit sanitation will be provided by Atlantic Transportation

1. Travel policy for students during the semester
 - a. There will be no sponsored travel for students.
 - b. Students who travel outside of the immediate area will be expected to quarantine for 14 days upon return.
 - c. Students will be advised of testing options prior to leaving campus and returning home.
 - d. Students will be advised to discuss family risk factors and quarantine for 14 days upon return home.
 - e. Students may remain in the residence hall over break.
2. Travel policy for faculty and staff
 - a. All sponsored travel must be approved by the direct line vice president prior to initiating travel.
 - b. All state and local orders surrounding isolation following travel must followed.
 - c. Based on CDC Guidelines on Travel within the US
3. Questions prior to travel
 - a. Is COVID-19 spreading where the individual is going?
 - b. Is COVID-19 spreading in your community?
 - c. What is your safety plan?
 - i. A written safety plan must be submitted to the direct line vice president including:
 - ii. Travel
 - iii. Lodging
 - iv. Mitigation strategies
 - v. Are those traveling more likely to get very ill from COVID-19?
 - d. Does the individual traveling live with someone who is more likely to get very ill from COVID-19?
 - e. Does the state or local government where you live or at your destination require you to stay home for 14 days after traveling? (All state and local orders surrounding isolation following travel must followed (*CDC Guidelines on International Travel*)
 - f. If you get sick with COVID-19, will essential operations be impacted?
4. International student travel
 - a. No international institution sponsored student travel is applicable
 - b. Students traveling from areas where there is widespread community transmission will not be allowed to travel to campus



5. Study Abroad Programs
 - a. Not applicable
6. Limiting visitors on campus
 - a. COVID Responsive Operations
 - i. No face to face
 - ii. No walk-ins, appointments required
 - iii. No groups larger than state or local limit or confined to a household unit.
 - iv. Limited walk-in hours for community members
